

### **School Profile 2017:**

## **Contextual Information**

Birlirr Ngawiyiwu Catholic School, Ringer Soak/Yaruman, is a remote, co-educational K-6 primary school in the north-western Tanami desert, located 168 km from Halls Creek. Birlirr Ngawiyiwu (Spirit of God) Catholic School was founded in 1986 by the Sisters of St Joseph, upon request from the Djaru Community. Birlirr Ngawiyiwu strives to empower young people to build lives based upon the Gospel values of love, truth, justice and peace.

Birlirr Ngawiyiwu Catholic School has an enrolment for 2017 of 32 children from PP-Year 6 (as well as 4 Kindergarten students), 94% of whom are indigenous children. The majority of the children commence school with English as their second or third language. The number of children fluctuates depending on cultural and social events.

In 2017 a nutrition program which consists of breakfast, supplied by Foodbank, a healthy recess and a hot lunch will carry over from previous years. Each classroom has access to computers, iPads and laptops. The ability to work in a collaborative environment as well as supporting independent learning will continue to be a whole school focus in 2017.

In recent years, renovations were undertaken to provide a more appropriate environment for Early Childhood learning. Other modifications included upgraded kitchen facilities and improved administration and library/teacher-resource facilities.

Areas of concern in our school which influence learning include:

- Hearing loss, which affects a substantial number of our students. The use of 'Soundfields' installed in all teaching areas continues to make a significant difference.
- Limited understanding of SAE (Standard Australian English) due to English as a second or third language prior to school.
- Continual irregular attendance and the transience of some families due to a range of cultural issues e.g., Funerals including extended 'Sorry time', Sporting events and Royalty Payment Meetings.
- Currently there is no Community Manager in Ringer Soak. As a result, the school supports community members by making facilities available every Thursday including access to telephones, fax and internet services.

- The Community Shop does not serve school aged children during school hours;
- Principal with an ATA visits students/families in the community to follow up nonattenders;
- The School encourages parents/caregivers not to take students out of the community during school terms;
- Regular attendance recognised during weekly and end of term assemblies with certificates and small prizes;
- Three meals a day are provided: Breakfast (Foodbank), Morning Tea and Lunch.



### Parent Satisfaction and Engagement.

The parents, as indicated from previous data collections, support the school. There is an open door policy with all staff to ensure that any issues and concerns are dealt with sensitively and compassionately. This allows all members of the school and wider community to work together to provide a stable, positive and engaging environment for learning to occur.

Birlirr Ngawiyiwu Catholic School adopted the 'Stronger Smarter Schools' philosophy in 2018 which aims to bring school and community closer together.

Stronger Smarter projects being worked on in 2018 are 1) to encourage more community members to interact with the school Facebook page, and 2) to encourage parents to engage with their children's academic results by attending Parent - Teacher interviews at the end of each school semester. The indigenous staff at the school provide an effective link between the school and the community.

### NOTE 1 BASIS OF PREPARATION

### (a)Basis of preparation

The Annual Financial Statement is a special purpose financial statement that has been prepared by the management of the School in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the School Board to the Catholic Education Office of Western Australia.

The School Board has determined that the School is not a reporting entity.

The Annual Financial Statement has been prepared on a cash basis whereby income is recorded when it is received and expenditure is recorded when it is paid.

No assets or liabilities other than cash and cash equivalents are recorded.

The School being a non-government school is part of a transitional reporting arrangement with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC). The ACNC receives financial information for the School from the Department of Education and Training.

### (b)Economic Dependency

The continuing operation of the School is dependent upon achieving and maintaining appropriate student enrolment numbers, the continuation of adequate funding from the Australian and State Governments in respect of operational and capital grants and the achievement of operating surpluses and positive operating cash flows.
